




Marc Aronson is an author, editor, publisher, public speaker, and historian who believes that young people, especially preteens and teenagers, are smart, passionate, and capable of engaging with interesting ideas in interesting ways.

A committed internationalist, Aronson has published two books that were selected as the best books in translation, and created *Edge*, an imprint designed to bring the voices of those who are coming of age around the world to American readers. It is his conviction that the mixing of genres, ideas, cultures, networks, and trade is the reality of the world young people are entering. His mission is to inspire young people to ask questions, to look around, behind, and inside of the stories the world tells us—whether that means being a detective, examining the clues history has left behind, or a reporter, telling the truth about the modern world.

Marc Aronson has won many awards and prizes for his books, including the Boston Globe-Horn Book Award, as well as the first Robert F. Sibert Award for *Sir Walter Raleigh and the Quest for El Dorado*. He has a doctorate in American history from NYU and runs the Nonfiction Matters blog at SLJ.com. He lives with his wife and coauthor, Marina Budhos, and their two sons in Maplewood, New Jersey.
