

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of the Alameda County Library jurisdiction increased by 7% in the last decade to 532,000. The white, non-Hispanic population fell by 25%, while the Asian population grew by 44%.


Diversity: The population mix of the Alameda County Library jurisdiction has shifted significantly since 2000, with the white, non-Hispanic population declining from 43% to 30% of total and the Asian population increasing from 28% to 37%. The Hispanic population increased to 21% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure of the Alameda County Library jurisdiction is similar to that of California overall. The share of population age 65+ is the same at 11%, but this jurisdiction has a slightly smaller share of young people (27%) and a slightly larger share of working-age population (63%).

Households: The traditional family—a married couple with children—is more prominent in this jurisdiction than in the state as a whole. Overall, 30% of households consist of traditional families compared with 23% statewide. In addition, relatively fewer individuals live alone: only 18% of households are single-person compared with 23% statewide.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 36% of the total population in the Alameda County Library jurisdiction, compared with 27% statewide. Among the foreign born, a relatively high percentage of individuals—70%—are from Asia.

Note: The Alameda County Library jurisdiction includes only a part of the county. It serves the county population not located within the city limits of the seven municipal libraries.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




