


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Alhambra, now 83,000, declined by 3% over the past ten years, unlike the state, which grew by 10%. The steepest declines occurred among young people (-17%) and white, non-Hispanics (-30%). In contrast, the Asian population grew by 8%.

Diversity: Alhambra now has a majority Asian population at 52% of the total, up from 47% in 2000. The Hispanic share of total population declined slightly over the past ten years from 36% to 34% and the white, non-Hispanic share declined from 14% to 10%. Among the population age 65+, 25% are Hispanic and 50% are Asian.

Age Structure: The population of Alhambra is relatively old, with a median age of 39 up from 35 ten years ago. This is significantly higher than the state median age of 35. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years as the number of young people declined and the number of people in the higher working-age brackets increased. The share of population age 65+ increased slightly from 13% to 14% of total.

Education: The overall level of educational attainment is similar to statewide rates, with 32% of adults having a Bachelor's degree or higher compared with 30% for the state, and 21% of adults not having completed high school compared with 20% statewide. Some variations by race and ethnicity differ for Alhambra. Only 36% of Asian adults in Alhambra have Bachelor's degrees, compared with 48% of Asians statewide, and 24% of Asian adults here have not completed high school, compared with 14% for Asians statewide.

Income: Alhambra's median household income, \$52,000, is 87% of the state median. The share of households with annual income less than \$25,000 is similar to that of California as a whole, 22% for Alhambra and 20% for the state.

Poverty: Poverty among the elderly is a concern, as 13% of individuals age 65 and over have incomes below the federal poverty line, compared with 8% statewide.


Foreign Born: The majority of the population, 51%, is foreign born. Seventy-four percent of the immigrants are from Asia and 24% are from Latin America. A relatively high share of all households, 25%, are linguistically isolated, compared with the statewide share of 10%.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




