

Highlights



Population Growth: Altadena’s total population, now 43,000, remained stable over the past ten years, compared with 10% growth statewide. Although the total level was unchanged, there were some changes across subgroups: the number of young people declined by nearly 14%, and the black population fell by 25%.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Altadena shifted over the past ten years with the Hispanic share increasing from 20% to 27% and the black share falling from 31% to 23%. The white, non-Hispanic population remained constant at 40%.


Age Structure: The population of Altadena is relatively old, with a median age of 42, compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years as the number of young people under age 20 declined and the share of the population age 65+ increased from 12% to 14%. The Hispanic population is relatively young, with a median age of 30, and accounts for 39% of the young people.

Education: Educational attainment for Altadena is generally higher than for California overall: 40% of the population has attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, with 86% of adults graduating from high school. Among Hispanic adults, 18% had attained a Bachelor’s degree compared with 10% for Hispanics statewide; 63% of Hispanic adults in Altadena have completed high school compared with 56% statewide.

Income: Altadena’s median household income, \$80,000, is 32% higher than the state median. The unemployment rate, 9% in June 2011, has been consistently below the statewide rate.

Foreign Born: A smaller share of the population is foreign born, 18%, than in the state as a whole (27%). The share of immigrants from Europe is higher at 13% compared with 7% statewide.

Note: The Altadena Library District extends beyond the boundary of the Altadena Census Designated Place. This profile covers only the population within the CDP boundary.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




