


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The total population in Anaheim increased by just 3% over the past decade to 336,000, while the state grew by 10% overall. The sharpest increases occurred among Hispanics (24,000) and Asians (10,000). Despite the overall growth, the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 25,000.

Diversity: Over the past decade, the Hispanic share of the population increased from 47% to 53% of total, while the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 36% to 28%. The Asian share also increased from 12% to 15% of total. Racial and ethnic composition varies substantially by age—young people are majority Hispanic at 68%, while people age 65+ are majority white, non-Hispanic at 55%.

Age Structure: Anaheim remains younger than California overall, though the age structure shifted upward slightly over the past decade. Median age increased from 30 to 32, compared with 35 for California. The share of population age 65+ grew only slightly from 8% to 9% of total, compared with 11% statewide, while the share of young people fell from 33% to 30%, compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Households are predominantly shared by family members—76% of households are family households compared with 69% statewide. Traditional families—married couples with children—are more common here, at 28% of households compared with 23% statewide, though this share is down from 34% in 2000.

Education: Educational attainment is lower in Anaheim than in California as a whole. Just 22% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 27% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall. More than half of Hispanic adults in Anaheim have not completed high school.


Foreign Born: Anaheim has a large foreign-born population making up 38% of the total—125,000 people. The majority of these individuals are from Mexico (58%) though Asia is a common region of origin as well (28%). Also, 16% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




