


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Arcadia grew by 6% over the past ten years to 56,000, growing slower than the statewide pace of 10%, but faster than Los Angeles County. Large gains occurred in the Asian and Hispanic populations, which increased by 38% and 21%, respectively. Most of the population gain occurred in the working-age population.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Arcadia has shifted significantly over the past ten years. Arcadia now has a 59% majority Asian population, up from 45% in 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population declined from 40% to 26%, and the Hispanic share of population increased slightly from 11% to 12% of total.

Age Structure: The population of Arcadia is relatively old, with a median age of 43, compared with 35 for the state. The share of population age 65+ remained at 16% of total, higher than the statewide share of 11%. The Asian population has a median age of 41, while the white, non-Hispanic population is significantly older, with a median age of 55.

Households: Household makeup changed only slightly in the last 10 years. Arcadia continues to have a larger than average share of family households, 77%, compared with 69% statewide. The share of families without children increased from 38% to 42% of all households.

Education: Arcadia’s educational attainment is well above state levels. Half of the adult population holds a Bachelor’s degree or higher compared with the California rate of 30%, and only 8% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide. Among Hispanic adults, 19% have not completed high school compared with 44% statewide.

Income: Median household income is \$78,000, 30% higher than the state median. Arcadia’s unemployment rate was 7% in June 2011, well below the state rate of 12%.


Foreign Born: Almost half of the population is foreign born (48%), compared with the statewide share of 27%. Of immigrants, 85% are from Asia and only 9% from Latin America, compared with statewide shares of 34% from Asia and 55% from Latin America.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




