

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Total population in Banning increased by 26% (6,000) over the past decade to 30,000, growing more than twice as fast as the state. Most of the gain occurred in the Hispanic population which grew by 71% (5,000).

**Diversity:** The population mix in Banning has shifted over the past ten years with the white, non-Hispanic share falling from its majority 52% to 43% and the Hispanic share increasing from 30% to 41%.


**Age Structure:** Banning's population is much older than California overall, with a median age of 42, compared with 35 statewide. The city has a much higher share of older people, 26% compared with 11% statewide, and a much smaller share of working-age people, 48% compared with 61% statewide. The white, non-Hispanic population is heavily concentrated in the older ages, while the Hispanic population is concentrated in the younger ages. Thus, the young population of Banning is predominantly Hispanic (63%), while the population age 65+ is predominantly white, non-Hispanic (78%).

**Households:** Family households without children, at 43% of total, are much more common in Banning than statewide (36%), and only 14% of all households are traditional families with a married couple and children, compared with 23% statewide. The share of single-person households has increased to 29% of all households, compared with 23% statewide.

**Education:** The share of adults not having completed high school matches the statewide share of 20%, but just 15% of adults have earned Bachelor's degrees, compared with 30% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income is \$40,000, just 67% of the California median. Twenty-eight percent of households have incomes less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




