





Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in the Belvedere-Tiburon Library Jurisdiction increased by 2% over the past ten years to 11,000. The working-age population declined by 10% during this period.

Diversity: The area remained predominantly white, non-Hispanic, although this group’s share of the population decreased slightly from 90% to 86% over the past ten years. The small Asian and Hispanic populations increased slightly.

Age Structure: Belvedere-Tiburon is much older than the state overall. The age structure shifted upward over the past decade, with the share of the population age 65 and older growing from 19% to 23% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Single-person households are common here, making up 28% of all households compared with 23% statewide. Among individuals 65+, 38% live alone, compared with 25% statewide.

Education: The population is highly educated, with 79% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of the state population. Only 1% of adults have not completed high school, compared with nearly 20% statewide.

Income: Incomes are relatively high in the jurisdiction. The median household income in Belvedere is \$118,000 and in Tiburon, \$147,000, compared with \$60,000 statewide. In the combined jurisdiction, 47% of households have income of more than \$150,000, compared with 12% of the state. Only 13% reported income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% of households in California.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 14% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Of this population, only 6% are from Latin America, compared with 55% in the state overall.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09





11. Household Language, 2005-09





13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11






14. Household Type, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*





16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
