


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Beverly Hills, now 34,000, increased only 1% over the past ten years, in contrast to 10% growth statewide.

Diversity: Beverly Hills remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic with the share of population at 79% of total, down from 82% in 2000. Over the past decade the Asian population increased from 7% to 9% of total and the Hispanic population increased from 5% to 6% of the total.

Age Structure: The population of Beverly Hills is relatively old, with a median age of 44, compared with 35 for the state. The share of population age 65+ increased slightly to 19% in 2010, well above the statewide share of 11%.

Households: Beverly Hills has a much smaller share of family households, 57%, than the statewide rate of 69%. Only 24% of households include children, compared with 33% for the state. In addition, individuals living alone account for 36% of all households, significantly higher than the statewide rate of 23%.

Education: Educational attainment levels are significantly above state averages; 58% of the adult population has achieved a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% for the state. Only 5% of the adult population has not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults in California.

Income: Median household income in Beverly Hills is \$82,000, 35% above the state median. The unemployment rate, 9% in June 2011, has been consistently below the statewide rate.


Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 37% of total population, well above the statewide share of 27%. Of the nearly 13,000 immigrants, 72% are from Asia and 17% are from Europe. Among the individuals born in Asia, more than two-thirds are from Iran.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




