


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Cerritos fell by 5% over the past ten years to 49,000, unlike California as a whole which grew by 10%. The number of young and working-age people decreased, while the population age 65+ grew.

Diversity: Cerritos continues to have a majority Asian population, which grew from 58% to 62% of total since 2000. Over the same period, the Hispanic share of the population increased from 10% to 12%, and the white, non-Hispanic share of population decreased from 21% to 17% of total.

Age Structure: The population of Cerritos is relatively old, with a median age of 44, compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years as the number of people under age 20 declined and the share of the population age 65+ increased dramatically from 10% to 18% of total—much higher than the statewide figure of 11%. The white, non-Hispanic population is notably older, with a median age of 57, while the median age of the Asian population is only 43.

Households: The share of family households is 86%, significantly higher than the statewide rate of 69%. Family households without children are especially common, accounting for 54% of all households, compared with 36% statewide. Among those 65+, 13% live alone, compared to 25% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in Cerritos is generally higher than for California overall: 50% of adults have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and only 8% of adults have less than a high school education, compared with 20% across the state.

Income: Median household income in Cerritos is \$86,000, 43% higher than the state median.


Foreign Born: Foreign-born individuals comprise 45% of the population, well above the statewide share of 27%. Most of the immigrants, 84%, are from Asia and only 8% are from Latin America.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010

In thousands; males on left, females on right




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




