


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in Colton increased by 9% over the last decade to 52,000, with a net increase of about 4,500 people. This includes a net increase of 8,000 in the population of Hispanics, and a net decrease of 3,000 in the population of white, non-Hispanics.

Diversity: The population in Colton is predominantly Hispanic, with the share of population at 71%, up from 61% in 2000. The white, non-Hispanic share of population decreased from 21% to 13% of total, and the black share of population decreased from 11% to 9% of total.

Age Structure: Colton is young, with a median age of only 28, compared with the statewide median age of 35. Only 7% of the population in Colton is age 65+, compared with 11% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in Colton is relatively low. Just 13% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California. More than 27% of adults in Colton have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide. Among Hispanic adults, 40% have not completed high school.

Income: Median household income in Colton is \$45,000, 74% of state median income. Unemployment was 15% in June 2011, higher than the statewide rate of 12%.


Foreign Born: The foreign-born population in Colton makes up 26% of the total, nearly the same as the share in California overall. The majority of these individuals are from Mexico, 69%, compared with 44% statewide. Additionally, 14% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




