


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Covina’s population increased by 2% over the past ten years to 48,000. The Hispanic population grew by about 6,000 while the white, non-Hispanic population declined by about the same amount.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Covina has shifted over the past decade, with Hispanics now making up the majority of the population. The Hispanic share of total population grew from 40% to 52%, while the white, non-Hispanic share declined from 42% to 30%.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted slightly upward over the past ten years with median age increasing from 34 to 36, just slightly higher than the state median of 35. The white, non-Hispanic population is notably older, with a median age of 49, compared to a median of only 29 for the Hispanic population.

Households: Family households, at 74% of total, are much more common in Covina than statewide (69%), and the share of family households without children increased from 34% to 40% of households compared with a statewide rate of 36%.

Education: Educational attainment in Covina is similar to that of the state in terms of high school completion, but lower in terms of college. Just over 17% of adults have less than a high school education, slightly lower than the statewide figure of 20%, but only 22% of adults in Covina have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole.

Income: Median household income in Covina is \$64,000—6% above the statewide median. Covina’s unemployment rate, 9% in June 2011, is below the state average of 12%.


Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for just over 21% of total population, compared with 27% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change

6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets



7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10






8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




