


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of San Marino increased by less than 2% to 13,000 over the past decade.

Diversity: San Marino now has a majority Asian population. In the last ten years the Asian share of population increased from 48% to 54% and the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 45% to 37% of total.

Age Structure: The population of San Marino is much older than the state population. San Marino’s median age of 45 is 10 years above the state median age of 35, and 18% of the population is age 65+, compared with 11% statewide. A notable feature of San Marino’s age structure is the relatively small number of people between ages 20 and 39.

Households: Family households are much more common in San Marino than statewide—86% compared to 69%. The share of traditional family households—married couples with children—at 35% is also much higher than the statewide level of 23%. In addition, the population age 65+ is more likely to live in a family household: 83% live with a spouse or other relatives, compared with 67% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in San Marino is among the highest in the state. More than 75% of adults have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, significantly higher than the statewide rate of 30%. Only 1% of adults have less than a high school education, compared with 20% in California overall.

Income: Household income in San Marino is among the highest in the state, with median household income of \$160,000, nearly three times the state median. The unemployment rate, 6% in June 2011, has consistently been well below the statewide rate.


Foreign Born: Foreign-born individuals account for 37% of the population, well above the state share of 27%. Of the immigrants, 82% are from Asia. Only 8% of households are linguistically isolated, compared with 10% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09




11. Household Language, 2005-09





12. Household Income, 2005-09



13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11




14. Household Type, 2010

% of all households




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




