

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in Daly City decreased by 2% over the past ten years, to 101,000. This population decline contrasts with a statewide population increase of 10% overall. Significant decreases occurred among young people and among white, non-Hispanic people.

Diversity: Daly City is majority Asian, at 55%, up from 50% in 2000. The Hispanic share of the population increased slightly from 22% to 24%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 18% to 14% of the total.


Age Structure: Daly City is somewhat older than California overall with a median age of 38, compared with the statewide median of 35 years old. Median age is up from 35 in 2000, and the young population declined by 4,000 people (-15%) over the past decade. The share of the population age 65+ is 13%, higher than the statewide share of 11%.

Households: Nineteen percent of households are single-person, which is less than the statewide share of 23%. Forty-five percent of households are families without children, compared to 30% statewide.

Income: Median income in Daly City is \$72,000, 20% higher than the statewide median of \$60,000.

Education: Educational attainment is slightly higher here than in California as a whole. Thirty-four percent of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California. Fourteen percent of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 52% of the total, almost double the statewide share of 27%. Of this population, 72% are from Asia, compared with just 34% statewide. Additionally, 16% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




