

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Population in the El Segundo grew by 4% over the past ten years to 17,000, growing at a rate similar to that of Los Angeles County, but slower than the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest increase occurred in the Hispanic population, which grew by 800 (48%).


**Diversity:** Unlike California and Los Angeles County overall, El Segundo is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though the white, non-Hispanic share of population declined from 77% to 69% over the past decade. The Hispanic share increased from 11% to 16% and the Asian share increased from 6% to 9%.

**Age Structure:** The age structure in El Segundo shifted upward slightly, with the median age rising from 36 to 39 due to an increase in working-age people. While the median age is higher than the statewide median of 35 years old, the share of population made up of those age 65+ is similar to California as a whole at 10%.

**Households:** Of households in El Segundo, 32% are single person compared with 23% statewide, and 21% are made up of married couples with children, roughly the same as the share in California as a whole. Among people age 65+, 40% live alone, a share much higher than the statewide rate of 25%.

**Education:** Educational attainment is high in El Segundo, with 50% of adults having Bachelor’s degrees or higher, compared with 30% in California overall. Just 4% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide.

**Income:** Incomes are relatively high in El Segundo across racial and ethnic groups, with median household income of \$88,000, 45% higher than the California median. The unemployment rate, 6% in June 2011, has consistently been below the California rate.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age                      b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




