

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The total population in Hemet increased by 34% over the last decade to 79,000, growing three times faster than the state. The Hispanic population added 15,000 (107%), while the black population grew by 3,000 (235%). The number of older people declined by 2,000 (-11%).

**Diversity:** The population mix has shifted dramatically over the past ten years with the majority white, non-Hispanic share falling from 70% to 52% and the Hispanic share increasing from 23% to 36%. The black population increased from 2% to 6%.

**Age Structure:** Hemet is older than California overall, but in contrast to the statewide aging trend, Hemet’s age structure shifted downward over the past decade. Median age decreased from 45 to 39, compared with the current statewide median of 35. The share of the population age 65+ fell from 33% to 22% of total, yet this is still much higher than the statewide figure of 11%.

**Households:** Family households, at 64% of total, are less common in Hemet than statewide (69%), and only 17% of households are traditional families with a married couple and children, compared with 23% statewide. Single-person households are more common here than statewide, 30% versus 23%, and a larger share of older individuals live alone, 34% compared with 25% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income is \$35,000, just 59% of the California median. Thirty-six percent of all households have income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




