

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population of Lincoln grew by 280% over the past decade, from 11,000 to 43,000, growing much faster than the statewide rate of 10%. Lincoln was among the fastest-growing cities in California. The greatest increase occurred among the white, non-Hispanic population, which grew by 23,000 people.


Diversity: Lincoln is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, with 71% of the total population, up slightly from 70% in 2000. Unlike the trends in Placer County and statewide, the white, non-Hispanic share of Lincoln’s population stayed constant over the past ten years, while the Hispanic share decreased from 26% to 18%. Nonetheless, both groups grew in number.

Age Structure: Lincoln is older than is California overall, and the area aged dramatically over the past decade. The median age was below the statewide median at 32 in 2000, and surpassed the state median to 41 in 2010. People age 65+ make up 24% of Lincoln’s population, compared with 11% in California as a whole and up from 11% in 2000.

Households: The share of households made up of families without children increased from 35% to 45% of total, while husband-wife families with children decreased from 29% to 23% of total households. Nearly one third of older people age 65+ live with a spouse, compared with 21% statewide.

Income: Median household income is \$72,000, which is 19% higher than the state median. Unemployment in Lincoln, at 20% in June 2011, has consistently been above the statewide rate.

Education: As Lincoln’s population grew, educational attainment improved. Only 8% of adults in Lincoln have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide. Just 11% of adults had attained a Bachelor’s degree in 2000, and this share is now 30%, the same as the share statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate






14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




