

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Livermore increased by 10% over the past ten years and now stands at 81,000. The population age 65+ increased by 51%, a rate much higher than the statewide growth rate of 18% for this age group.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Livermore shifted over the past ten years with the predominantly white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 74% to 65% of total and the Hispanic share increasing from 14% to 21%.

Age Structure: The population of Livermore is relatively old, with a median age of 38, compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years as the share of young people declined and the share of population age 65+ increased from 8% to 10%. The high median age stems from the relatively high concentration of people in the upper working-age brackets, even though the share of 65+ is slightly less than the state's 11% level.

Education: Educational attainment is higher in Livermore than in the state. Thirty-six percent of adults have at least a Bachelor’s degree compared with 30% statewide. In addition, only 9% of adults did not graduate from high school compared with 20% in California.

Income: Median household income in Livermore is 57% higher than the statewide median of \$60,000, and nearly 26% of all households had incomes of \$150,000 or higher, compared with 12% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




