




Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** The total population of Lodi increased by 9% over the past decade, to 62,000. The Hispanic population grew by more than 7,000 (46%), while the white, non-Hispanic population fell by 3,000 (-8%).

**Diversity:** The white, non-Hispanic population, still the largest group, decreased from 64% to 53% of total, while the Hispanic population increased from 27% to 36% of total.

**Age Structure:** Lodi's population age structure is similar to the state's. The median age is slightly lower, 34 compared with 35 statewide, mostly because Lodi has a larger share of young people. The population age 65+ accounts for 13% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** The household mix in Lodi matches the statewide mix, with family households accounting for 69% of total and married couples with children declining to 23% of total. For the older population, the pattern diverges from the state trend; 28% of Lodi's population age 65+ lives in group homes, compared with only 4% statewide.

**Education:** Adults in Lodi are relatively less educated than adults statewide, with only 19% of adults having a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole. The share of adults who have less than a high school diploma is 22%, slightly higher than the 20% rate in California.


**Income:** Median household income in Lodi, \$50,000, is 82% of the statewide median. Twenty-three percent of households have incomes less than \$25,000 compared with 20% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




