


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in this jurisdiction increased by 2.5% over the past ten years, to 138,000. The greatest increase occurred in the Hispanic population (7,000), and the largest decline was in the working-age white, non-Hispanic population.

Diversity: This jurisdiction remains majority white, non-Hispanic, although this group’s share of the population declined from 79% to 74% of total over the past decade. The Hispanic share increased from 9% to 14% of the total.

Age Structure: This area is older than the state overall and the age structure shifted upward over the past ten years. The share of the population age 65+ increased from 12% to 16% of total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Single-person households are common here—28% percent of all households consist of individuals living alone, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: The population is highly educated, with 51% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of the state population. Only 7% of the population has less than a high school degree, compared with nearly 20% statewide.

Income: Households in this jurisdiction report relatively high incomes, with 26% of households earning more than \$150,000 compared with 12% at this level statewide. Only 12% reported household income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% of California households.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for only 17% of the total, compared with 27% statewide, and the composition by region of origin differs from California as well. Just 20% of immigrants are from Mexico, compared with 44% in the state, and 27% are from Europe, compared with 7% statewide.


Note: The Marin County Free Library serves the county population not served by the five municipal libraries and the one joint powers library.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate






14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




