

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in Mariposa County increased by 7% over the last ten years to 18,000. This is slightly lower than the California growth rate of 10%. Growth occurred in the working and older ages, while the number of young people declined.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition has remained relatively constant since 2000 and the county is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, at 83%.


Age Structure: Mariposa County is much older than the state overall, and the age structure shifted upward over the past decade. Median age increased from 43 to 49, well above the statewide median of 35. The share of the population age 65+ is 21%, up from 17% in 2000 and compared with just 11% statewide.

Households: Only 14% of households are traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% statewide. Twenty-eight percent of households are single-person, compared with 23% in California overall.

Education: Educational attainment in Mariposa County is somewhat mixed. Only 10% of adults have not completed high school, significantly better than the 20% statewide level. However, only 18% have a Bachelor’s degree, compared with 30% statewide.

Income: Mariposa County has lower income levels than the state as a whole, with median income of \$48,000 compared with the state median of \$60,000.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for only 4% of the total population, compared with 27% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




