

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Mono County grew by 10% to 14,000 over the last decade. This is equal to the statewide growth rate. The greatest growth occurred in the Hispanic population (1,000).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Mono County has shifted somewhat over the past ten years, although it remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic. The white, non-Hispanic population declined from 77% to 68% of the total population. The Hispanic population now accounts for 26% of the total population, up from 18% in 2000.


Age Structure: Mono County is somewhat older than the state overall with a median age of 37, compared with the California median of 35. The share of the population age 65+ is 10%, just below the statewide share of 11%, while the share of young people is 23%, compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Nonfamily households consisting of a householder living alone or two or more unrelated individuals are more common in Mono County than statewide—41% of households here compared with 31% in California overall. Twenty-eight percent of households are single-person, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in Mono County is higher than in California overall. Only 10% of adults have less than a high school diploma, compared with 20% statewide. The percentage of adults with a Bachelor’s degree is similar to the statewide share.

Income: Median household income is \$52,000, 86% of the state median income of \$60,000.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population share, at 17%, is significantly lower than the statewide share of 27%. Fifty-nine percent of this population is from Mexico, compared with 44% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change

6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets



7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10






8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




