


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** Population in Monrovia declined by 1% over the past ten years to 37,000, while Los Angeles County grew by 3% and California by 10%. The greatest declines occurred among the white, non-Hispanic population (-2,000) and young people (-1,500).

**Diversity:** The population mix has shifted over the last decade, with the Hispanic share of population increasing from 35% to 38% and the Asian share from 7% to 11%, while the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 47% to 41%.

Race and ethnicity vary substantially by age—people under age 20 are majority Hispanic, 53%, and people age 65+ are majority white, non-Hispanic, 58%.

**Age Structure:** Over the past ten years, Monrovia shifted from being slightly younger than the state as a whole to slightly older. The median age increased from 34 to 38, higher than the state median of 35 years old, due to a decrease in the number of young people and an increase in the working-age and older populations. The share of the population age 65+ increased from 10% to 12% of the total, while the share of young people declined from 30% to 26%.

**Households:** Older people in Monrovia are more likely to be living in a group home than older people statewide—9% of people age 65+ compared with 4%. They are also more likely to be living alone—29% compared with 25%.


**Education:** Educational attainment is slightly higher in Monrovia than in California overall. In particular, Asian and Hispanic adults have substantially higher educational attainment here than statewide. In Monrovia, 64% of Asians have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 48% in California overall, and just 8% have not completed high school, compared with 14% in the state. Similarly, 19% of Hispanic adults in Monrovia have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 10% statewide, and 33% have not completed high school, compared with 44% in California.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




