


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** Total population in Monterey Park remained unchanged over the past ten years at 60,000, while Los Angeles County grew by 3% and California by 10%. Although total population stayed the same, the Asian population increased by 3,000 (8%), and the number of young people decreased by 1,800 (-12%).

**Diversity:** Monterey Park is majority Asian and becoming increasingly so. The Asian share of the population increased from 61% to 66% over the past ten years, while the Hispanic share decreased from 29% to 27%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 7% to 5% of total.

**Age Structure:** Monterey Park is older than California overall and the age structure shifted upward over the past decade. Median age increased from 38 to 43, compared with an increase from 33 to 35 for California. This shift was due to an increase in the older population and a decrease in the number of young people. The share of population age 65+ is 19%, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** Households are predominantly made up of families—76% of households are family households, compared with 69% statewide. However, 50% of households are families without children, up from 46% in 2000, and compared with 36% statewide. The majority, 58%, of people age 65+ live with relatives other than a spouse.


**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born share of population is very high in Monterey Park, at 53%, compared with 27% in California overall. A large majority of this population is from Asia, 84%, compared with 34% statewide. Additionally, 31% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.” This is much higher than the 10% share in California.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




## 7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




## 8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




## 9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

## 11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




