

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Monterey decreased by 6% over the last decade to 28,000, in contrast with statewide growth of 10%. This can be almost entirely attributed to a decrease in the white, non-Hispanic population.


Diversity: Monterey remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic (75% of the total population). The Hispanic share of the population grew from 11% to 14% over the last decade.

Age Structure: Monterey’s age structure changed little between 2000 and 2010. The median age is 37, compared with 35 for the state. Sixteen percent of the population is age 65+, higher than the statewide rate of 12%.

Households: Fourteen percent of households are traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% statewide. Thirty-nine percent of households are people living alone, compared with 23% statewide. Among those age 65+, 12% live in group homes, three times the statewide rate.

Education: Monterey’s population has high levels of educational attainment, with half of adults having completed a Bachelor’s degree, more than double the 20% share in California as a whole. Only 6% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for only 19% of the total population, compared with 27% statewide. Only 29% of this population is from Latin America, compared with 55% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate






14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




