
**Population Growth:** The population of Moorpark grew by 10% between 2000 and 2010 and currently stands at 34,000; this growth was consistent with the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest absolute increase occurred among the Hispanic population, which grew by more than 2,000 (24%).

**Diversity:** Moorpark remains majority white, non-Hispanic, yet its racial and ethnic composition has changed since 2000. Over the past decade, the white, non-Hispanic share of the population declined from 62% to 57% of total, while the Hispanic share increased slightly, from 28% to 31% of the total.

**Age Structure:** Moorpark’s overall age structure now closely resembles that of California as a whole, with a median age of 35 years old. However, over the past ten years the city has aged much more rapidly than has the state. The population age 65+ increased by 72%, a rate much greater than the statewide growth rate of 18% for this age group. Further, the young population declined by 9% over the same time period.

**Households:** The traditional family—a married couple with children—is more common in Moorpark than in the state as a whole. Overall, 35% of the city’s households consist of traditional families compared with 23% statewide. In addition, fewer households are single-person: 13% of households consist of individuals living alone compared with 23% in the state.

**Income:** Household income in Moorpark is relatively high compared with income across California; median household income is \$98,000, 62% greater than the statewide median of \$60,000. Median income is greatest among black households, at \$130,000, compared with \$43,000 for black households statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




