

Highlights




Population Growth: The total population in Moreno Valley increased by 36% over the past decade to 193,000, growing more than three times faster than the state. The Hispanic population increased by 50,000 (92%) and the black population by 6,000 (21%). In contrast, the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 9,000 (-20%).

Diversity: Moreno Valley became majority Hispanic during the past ten years, with the Hispanic share of population increasing from 38% to 54% of total. The white, non-Hispanic share fell from 32% to 19%.

Age Structure: Moreno Valley is young relative to the state, though the age structure has shifted upward over the past decade. Median age increased from 27 to 29, still well below the statewide median of 35, and the share of the population age 65+ increased from 5% to 6%, much lower than the statewide figure of 11%. Young people under age 20 account for 36% of the population, compared with just 28% in California overall.

Households: Family households, at 84% of total, are much more common in Moreno Valley than statewide (69%) and traditional families—married couples with children—are also more common here, accounting for 31% of all households, compared with 23% statewide. The majority of older people, 59%, live with relatives other than a spouse.

Education: The population here is less educated than in California as a whole. Just 15% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree, compared with 30% statewide, and 26% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




