

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in Newport Beach increased by 22% over the past decade to 85,000, while California grew by just 10% overall. Large gains occurred in the population age 65+ (32%) and the population age 0-19 (35%).


Diversity: Newport Beach remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though over the last ten years this share fell from 89% to 82%, while the Hispanic share increased from 5% to 7%, and the Asian share increased from 4% to 7% of total.

Age Structure: This jurisdiction is older than California overall, with a median age of 44, compared with 35 for California. People age 65+ make up 19% of the population compared with 11% statewide, and people under age 20 account for just 19%, compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Nonfamily households, including householders living alone or with one or more unrelated individuals, are common here—46% of households compared with 31% statewide. Traditional families—married couples with children—are less common, with 16% of households, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment for Newport Beach is significantly higher than for California overall. Just 2% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 61% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California.

Income: Newport Beach is one of the wealthiest library jurisdictions in the state. Median household income is \$108,000, which is 78% higher than the California median of \$60,000. Thirty-seven percent of households have incomes of \$150,000 or higher, compared with 12% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




