


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The total population in the City of Orange increased over the past decade to 136,000, a rate of 6%, compared with 10% statewide. The greatest increase occurred among Hispanics (11,000), and despite the overall growth, the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 6,000.

Diversity: The population mix has shifted over the past ten years, with the Hispanic share of population increasing from 32% to 38%, the Asian share increasing from 9% to 11%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 55% to 47% of total. Racial and ethnic composition varies substantially by age—young people are majority Hispanic at 52% and people age 65+ are majority white, non-Hispanic at 70%.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted slightly upward in Orange, with the median age increasing from 33 to 35, mirroring the shift that occurred in California overall. The share of population age 65+ also increased slightly from 10% to 11% of total.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are slightly more common here, with 25% of households compared with 23% statewide.

Income: Incomes are relatively high in this jurisdiction. Median household income is \$77,000, which is 27% higher than the California median.


Foreign Born: Orange has a fairly large foreign-born population making up 26% of the total—35,000 people. The majority of these individuals are from Mexico, 57%, compared with 44% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




