

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The total population in Palm Springs increased by less than 2,000 (4%) over the past decade to 45,000. The Hispanic population accounted for most of the gain, adding more than 1,000 (11%). The number of young people fell by 1,000 (-15%), while the working-age population grew by more than 2,000 (10%).

**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic composition has shifted only slightly since 2000. The Hispanic share of total population increased from 24% to 25%, while the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 67% to 64%. The young population is now majority Hispanic at 58%, while the population age 65+ is predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 87%.

**Age Structure:** The population in Palm Springs is much older than in California overall, and the age structure has shifted upward over the past ten years. Median age is 52, up from 47 in 2000 and much higher than the statewide median of 35. The share of young people declined from 19% to 15% of total, compared with 28% statewide, and the share of working-age people increased. People age 65+ make up 27% of the population, compared with just 11% statewide.

**Households:** Nonfamily households, including householders living alone or with one or more unrelated individuals, are the majority here—62% of households compared with 31% statewide. Married couples with children are especially uncommon—just 7% of households compared with 23% statewide. Older people are more likely to be living alone—36% here compared with 25% in California overall.

**Income:** Median household income is \$44,000, just 73% of the California median, and 27% of households report income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




