

Highlights



**Population Growth:** The total population in the Placer County Library jurisdiction grew by 19% over the past decade to 187,000. This is lower than Placer County’s overall growth rate of 40% but greater than California’s rate of 10%.


**Diversity:** This jurisdiction is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though this share of the population declined over the past decade from 86% to 81%, while the Hispanic share increased from 8% to 11% and the Asian share from 2% to 4% of total.

**Age Structure:** The age structure shifted upward only slightly over the past decade. The portion of the population age 65+ increased from 13% to 15%, while the share of young people decreased from 29% to 26% of total.

**Households:** Consistent with the state trend, husband-wife families with children decreased from 28% to 24% of total households, while the portion of families without children grew from 38% to 40%. People age 65+ in this jurisdiction are more likely to live with a spouse at 27%, compared with 21% statewide.

**Education:** Educational attainment is higher here than in the state overall. Just 8% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 34% have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide.

*Note: The Placer County Library serves the county population that is not served by the two municipal libraries.*








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010











10. Foreign Born, 2005-09
