


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Pomona decreased very slightly over the last ten years to 149,000, while California grew by 10%. Although the overall decrease in population was small, the population of young people declined by 14%, while the numbers of working-age adults and older people age 65+ increased.

Diversity: Pomona remains majority Hispanic, with this share of the population increasing over the last decade from 65% to 71%. The white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreased from 17% to 13% over the same period.

Age Structure: Although the median age increased from 26 to 30 in the last ten years, Pomona remains relatively young when compared with California, which has a median age of 35. There was an increase in the population age 65+, but this group makes up only 8% of the total, compared with 11% statewide. Median age varies by race and ethnicity—the white, non-Hispanic population is older, with a median age of 45, while the median age of Hispanics is just 26 years old.

Households: The share of traditional families—married couples with children—decreased significantly from 37% of all households in 2000 to 29% in 2010. The share of family households without children increased from 28% to 36%, the same as the share in California overall.

Education: Educational attainment has improved, but it remains below statewide levels. Thirty-seven percent of adults have not completed high school, nearly twice the 20% share in California as a whole. Only 14% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide.

Income: Median household income is \$50,000, 82% of the California median income of \$60,000.


Foreign Born: The foreign-born population makes up 36% of the total, higher than the statewide share of 27%. The majority of these individuals (70%) are from Mexico, with another 12% from other Latin American countries. Additionally, 17% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




