

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in Rancho Cucamonga increased by 29% in the past decade to 165,000, growing three times the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest increases were in the black population (9,000 people) and the Hispanic population (22,000 people).


Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Rancho Cucamonga shifted over the past decade, with no single group making up a majority any longer. The white, non-Hispanic share of the population declined from 55% to 43%, while the Hispanic share increased from 28% to 35% of total. The Asian population also grew to 10% of the population, up from 6% in 2000, and the black population grew from 8% to 9% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward slightly over the past decade, with median age increasing from 32 to 35 years old. People age 65+ make up 8% of the population, up from 6% in 2000, still below the state share of 11% of population.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are more common in this area with 28%, compared with 23% statewide, though this share is down from 35% in 2000. The majority, 56%, of people age 65+ live with relatives.

Education: Educational attainment is relatively high in Rancho Cucamonga in terms of high school completion. Just 10% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California, and 28% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide.

Income: Incomes are relatively high in this jurisdiction. Median household income is \$78,000, 29% higher than the California median. Almost 37% of households report income of \$100,000 or over, compared with 27% statewide.




Population by Age




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




