


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Total population in the Riverside County Library System jurisdiction increased by nearly 400,000 (48%) over the past ten years, reaching 1.2 million in 2010, and growing almost five times faster than the state. The Hispanic population increased by 255,000 (81%) and the white, non-Hispanic population grew by 64,000 (15%). The Asian population more than tripled, adding 42,000, and the black population increased by 19,000 (60%).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition shifted significantly over the past decade, with Hispanics becoming the largest group. The Hispanic share of total population increased from 39% to 47%, while the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 53% to 41%.

Age Structure: This area has relatively more young people but fewer working-age people than the state, making the overall population younger than the state. The share of young people here is 32%, compared with 28% statewide, and the working-age share is 56%, compared with 61% statewide. The age mix has remained relatively constant over the decade, but growth in the younger ages has reduced the share of older people from 13% to 12%.

Households: Family households, at 76% of total, are much more common in this jurisdiction than statewide (69%). In particular, traditional families—married couples with children—account for 28% of all households, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is lower here than in California overall. Just 19% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 22% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall.




1. Population by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010

2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010





4. Population Total, 1990-2010




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




