

Highlights




Population Growth: Total population in the City of Riverside increased by 19% over the past decade to 304,000, growing nearly twice as fast as the state. The Hispanic population grew by 52,000 (53%) and the Asian population grew by 8,000 (54%). The white, non-Hispanic population declined by 13,000 (-11%).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition has shifted significantly since 2000, with the Hispanic share of total population increasing from 38% to 49% and the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 46% to 34%. Ethnicity varies substantially by age—the young population is majority Hispanic at 62%, while the population age 65+ is majority white, non-Hispanic at 60%.

Age Structure: The City of Riverside is much younger than California overall, and the age structure has remained fairly constant over the past decade. Median age is 30, compared with 35 statewide, and the population age 65+ is only 9% of total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are slightly more common here than statewide, accounting for 25% of all households compared with 23% statewide. Nonfamily households and single-person households are less common here than statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is lower here than in California overall. Just 22% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 23% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




