

Highlights



**Population Growth:** The population of the San Diego County Library jurisdiction increased by 9% over the past decade to 1 million, a similar growth rate to the statewide figure of 10%. The greatest growth occurred among Hispanics (80,000) and Asians (19,000). Despite the overall growth, the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 24,000.


**Diversity:** This jurisdiction remained majority white, non-Hispanic, though this share of the population declined from 67% to 59% of the total between 2000 and 2010. Meanwhile, the Hispanic share increased from 22% to 28% of total. Race and ethnicity vary substantially by age—the population under age 20 is 46% white, non-Hispanic, and 39% Hispanic, while the population age 65+ is predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 81%.

**Age Structure:** The age structure in this area is similar to California overall, and it shifted upward slightly during the past decade. The working and older populations grew, while the number of young people stayed relatively constant. The share of young people declined from 30% to 27% of the total.

**Households:** Similar to statewide trends, traditional families—married couples with children—declined from 28% to 24% of all households during the past decade. The share of families without children increased from 35% to 39% of total.

**Education:** Bachelor’s degree attainment is similar here and statewide, but high school completion is higher here than in California overall. Just 14% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

*Note: The San Diego County Library jurisdiction includes the county population that is not served by the seven municipal libraries.*




**1. Population by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010**

**2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010**





**4. Population Total, 1990-2010**




**5. 10-Year Population Change**








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




