

Highlights



Population Growth: San Francisco's population grew by 4% between 2000 and 2010 to a total of 805,000. The Asian population grew by 28,000 (12%) and the Hispanic population grew by 12,000 (11%). In contrast, the black population declined by 12,000 (-20%) and the white, non-Hispanic population was relatively stable.

Diversity: The overall racial and ethnic makeup of San Francisco has changed only slightly since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population, still the largest group, decreased slightly to 42% of the total, while the Asian population increased slightly to 33% of total.


Age Structure: San Francisco is relatively old with a median age of 39 compared with 35 statewide. San Francisco's population is more heavily concentrated in the working ages (71%) than the state overall (61%), and the city has a much smaller share of young people, 16%, than the statewide share of 28%. The population age 65+ remains at 14% of total.

Households: More than half the households in San Francisco are nonfamily households; 39% are single-person households compared with 23% statewide, and 18% are composed of unrelated individuals, compared with just 8% statewide. Traditional family households—married couples with children—account for only 12% of all households, about half the statewide rate.

Education: Educational attainment in San Francisco is higher than in the state overall. Just 14% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 51% have earned Bachelor's degrees or higher, compared with 30% statewide.

Income: San Francisco's median household income is \$70,000, 16% higher than the California median of \$60,000. Twenty percent of households have incomes of \$150,000 or more, compared with 12% statewide.

Foreign Born: San Francisco has a large foreign-born population, making up 34% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The majority of the immigrants are from Asia (62%). Thirteen percent of all households are linguistically isolated, compared with 10% statewide.



Population by Age






2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




