



Highlights

Population Growth: The total population in San Jose increased by 6% over the past decade to 946,000, slower than the statewide growth rate of 10%. The greatest growth occurred among Asians (62,000) and Hispanics (44,000). The white, non-Hispanic population declined by 51,000.

Diversity: San Jose’s population mix is relatively evenly split between white, non-Hispanics (29%), Asians (32%), and Hispanics (33%). The Asian and Hispanic shares of the population have increased over the last decade, while the white, non-Hispanic share has decreased. Race and ethnicity vary somewhat by age, with Hispanics making up 44% of young people, and white, non-Hispanics making up 47% of older people age 65+.


Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward slightly during the last decade. Median age increased from 33 to 35, the same as the current statewide median. The share of the population age 65+ increased from 8% to 10%, just below the statewide figure of 11%. The number of young people declined slightly, while the numbers of working-age and older people increased.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are somewhat more common here, making up 28% of all households, compared with 23% statewide. The majority of older people, 54%, live with relatives other than a spouse.

Education: Educational attainment is slightly higher than in the state overall. Eighteen percent of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 36% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California overall.

Income: Median household income is \$79,000, 30% higher than the California median of \$60,000.

Foreign Born: San Jose has an especially large foreign-born population, making up 38% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The majority of these individuals (58%) are from Asia. Additionally, 14% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”




Population by Age




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




