

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in Santa Ana decreased by 4% over the past decade to 325,000, while California grew by 10%. The sharpest declines occurred among young people (-13%) and white, non-Hispanics (-29%).


Diversity: Santa Ana remains predominantly Hispanic. The racial and ethnic composition shifted only slightly over the past decade, with the Hispanic share of population increasing from 76% to 78%, the Asian share increasing from 9% to 10%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 12% to 9% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted slightly upward between 2000 and 2010, but Santa Ana remains the youngest city in Orange County. The median age increased from 27 to 29, compared with 35 for the state and 36 for the county. The share of young people declined from 38% to 34%, compared with the statewide share of 28%.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are much more common here, at 34% of households, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is significantly lower for Santa Ana than for California overall. Just 11% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 49% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California. Over 60% of Hispanic adults here have not completed high school.

Foreign Born: Santa Ana has a large foreign-born population, making up 49% of the total—167,000 people. These individuals are predominantly from Mexico (79%). Also, a considerable portion of households, 29%, are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




