

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in the city of Santa Clara increased by 14% over the past decade to 116,000, slightly faster than the statewide growth rate of 10%. The greatest growth occurred in the Asian population (14,000).


Diversity: Santa Clara’s population mix has shifted over the last decade, with the white, non-Hispanic share declining from 48% to 36%, the Asian share increasing from 29% to 37%, and the Hispanic share increasing from 16% to 19% of total.

Age Structure: Santa Clara’s population is slightly younger and more concentrated in the working ages than California’s population overall. The age structure remained fairly constant over the past decade, with median age increasing from 33 to 34, compared with the statewide median of 35.

Education: Educational attainment is much higher than in the state overall. Just 10% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 47% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults in California overall.

Income: Median household income is \$83,000, 38% higher than the California median. Forty-one percent of households have income of \$100,000 or more, compared with 27% statewide.

Foreign Born: Santa Clara has an especially large foreign-born population, making up 39% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Of this population, 68% are from Asia and only 16% are from Latin America.




Population by Age




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




