


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The total population in the Santa Clara County Library jurisdiction increased by 4% over the past decade to 411,000, slower than the statewide growth rate of 10%. The greatest growth occurred in the Asian population (36,000) and the Hispanic population (15,000), while the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 36,000.

Diversity: Santa Clara County’s population mix has shifted significantly over the last ten years, with the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 52% to 41%, the Asian share increasing from 23% to 31%, and the Hispanic share increasing from 20% to 23% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure is similar to California’s overall structure, shifting slightly upward over the past decade. The share of the population age 65+ increased from 10% to 12%, slightly higher than the statewide share of 11%.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are more common here, making up 31% of all households, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is higher than in the state overall. Just 12% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 49% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California overall.

Income: Incomes are relatively high in this jurisdiction, with 30% of households reporting income of \$150,000 or higher, compared with 12% statewide.

Foreign Born: Foreign-born individuals represent 31% of the total population, compared with the statewide share of 27%. Of the immigrants, 63% are from Asia and only 24% are from Latin America.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




