


Highlights



**Population Growth:** The population of Santa Clarita increased by 17% over the past ten years, faster than the statewide pace (10%). Large gains occurred in the Hispanic population (21,000) and in the Asian population (7,000), while the white, non-Hispanic population decreased by nearly 6,000. Most of the population gain occurred among working-age adults.



Population by Age

**Diversity:** The population mix has shifted significantly over the last decade. The white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreased from 69% to 56%, the Hispanic share increased from 20% to 29%, and the Asian share increased from 5% to 8% of total.

**Age Structure:** The age structure in Santa Clarita shifted upward between 2000 and 2010, with the median age increasing from 33 to 36, similar to the statewide median age of 35. The white, non-Hispanic population is significantly older with a median age of 42, while Hispanics have a median age of 28. Ten percent of the population is made up of people age 65+, slightly lower than the statewide share of 11%.

**Households:** The share of traditional families—married couples with children—declined substantially from 37% of all households in 2000 to 29% in 2010. Despite the decrease, this share remains higher than the statewide rate of 23%. Families without children increased from 30% to 36% of all households, the same as the share in California.

**Education:** Educational attainment in Santa Clarita is slightly higher than in California as a whole. Among adults, only 13% have less than a high school education compared with 20% statewide, and 32% have a Bachelor’s degree or higher compared with 30% in California overall.


**Income:** Median household income in Santa Clarita is \$83,000, 37% higher than the state median income.




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




