


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** Santa Monica’s population increased by 7% over the past ten years to 90,000, compared with 3% growth for Los Angeles County and 10% for California. The largest gains occurred among Asians (2,000), white, non-Hispanics (2,000), and the working-age population (4,000).

**Diversity:** Santa Monica remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic, at 70% of total population, down from 72% in 2000. The Asian share of the population increased from 7% to 9% over the same period. The population mix varies by age bracket: white, non-Hispanics constitute 79% of the population age 65+, and Hispanics only 9%. In the 0-19 age bracket, the shares are less disparate: white, non-Hispanics account for 57%, and Hispanics 21%.

**Age Structure:** The population of Santa Monica is relatively old, with a median age of 40—well above the statewide median of 35. Over the past decade the share of young people remained constant at 16% of total, much lower than the statewide share of 28%. The share of people age 65+ increased slightly from 14% to 15%, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** Santa Monica continues to have a large share of single-person households, at 48%, compared with 23% statewide. Only 11% of households are made up of traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% in California.

**Education:** Educational attainment is well above state levels: 62% of the adult population holds a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole, and only 5% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.


**Income:** Median household income is \$67,000, 11% higher than the state median.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




