

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in South San Francisco increased by 5% over the last decade, to 64,000. This increase is half the 10% growth rate seen statewide. The Asian population increased by 6,000, and the white, non-Hispanic population decreased by 4,000.


Diversity: The population mix has shifted over the last ten years, with the Asian share of the population increasing from 29% to 36%, the Hispanic share increasing from 32% to 34%, and the white, non-Hispanic share falling from 31% to 22% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward slightly in South San Francisco with the median age increasing from 36 to 38, higher than the state median age of 35. The share of adults age 65+ remained constant at 13%, higher than the statewide share of 11%.

Education: Educational attainment in South San Francisco is somewhat higher than in California overall. Here 15% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide, and 32% of adults have earned a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 30% in California.

Income: Median household income in South San Francisco is \$72,000, 20% higher than the statewide median income of \$60,000.

Foreign Born: South San Francisco has a large foreign-born population accounting for 40% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Of this population, 58% are from Asia.




Population by Age


1. Population by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010

Legend: White,NH (blue), Black,NH (light blue), Asian,NH (grey), Other,NH (yellow), Hispanic (orange)




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




