


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Stanislaus County increased by 15% in the last decade to 514,000; a growth rate slightly higher than the 10% statewide rate.

Diversity: The population mix has shifted over the last decade, and white, non-Hispanics no longer comprise the majority of the population in Stanislaus County. The share of white, non-Hispanics declined from 57% to 47%, while the Hispanic population share increased from 32% to 42%.

Age Structure: Stanislaus County is slightly younger than the state as a whole, with a median age of 33 compared with California’s median age of 35. Young people make up 32% of the county’s population compared with 28% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment levels are lower in Stanislaus County than in California as a whole. Only 16% of adults have a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide. Also, 25% of adults did not complete high school, compared with the 20% rate for California as a whole.


Income: Household income in Stanislaus County is relatively low compared with income statewide. Median household income in the county is \$52,000, 85% of the statewide median of \$60,000. Unemployment in Stanislaus—17% as of June 2011—is significantly higher than California’s rate of 12%.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




