

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The population of Thousand Oaks grew by 8% between 2000 and 2010 and currently stands at 127,000; this growth was slightly slower than the statewide growth rate of 10%. This increase was concentrated among the Hispanic population (39%) and the population age 65+ (43%), which each increased by 6,000 people.

**Diversity:** Thousand Oaks remains majority white, non-Hispanic, yet its racial and ethnic composition has shifted somewhat since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population now comprises 70% of the population, down from 78% in 2000. Conversely, the Hispanic share of the population increased from 13% to 17% of the total.

**Age Structure:** The population of Thousand Oaks is relatively old, with a median age of 42, compared with the statewide median of 35. Further, 15% of the population is age 65+, whereas only 11% of California’s total population falls within this age bracket.

**Education:** Educational attainment in Thousand Oaks is significantly higher than in California as a whole. Overall, 48% of adults have at least a Bachelor’s degree; this figure is 30% statewide. Similarly, only 6% of adults did not graduate from high school, compared with 20% across the state.

**Income:** Household income in Thousand Oaks is relatively high compared with income in California as a whole; median household income is \$99,000, 63% greater than the statewide median of \$60,000. Poverty rates are relatively low as well; 5% of people live in poverty, compared with 13% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




