

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Trinity County increased by 6% over the past decade to 14,000; this growth was notably less than the statewide rate of 10%. The young population declined by 400 (-14%) over this period, while the population age 65+ grew by 500 (24%).

Diversity: Trinity County remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic (84%), although this figure has declined slightly since 2000 when it was 87%. Conversely, the Hispanic population share increased from 4% to 7% over the same period.

Age Structure: Trinity County is much older than California as a whole. Twenty percent of the county’s population is age 65+, compared with 11% statewide. This is reflected in the median age, which at 49, is substantially higher than the statewide median of 35.

Households: The traditional family—a married couple with children—is relatively less common in Trinity County than in California overall. Only 11% of households consist of traditional families compared with 23% statewide. Further, 32% of households in Trinity County are single-person compared with 23% in California as a whole.

Income: Household income in Trinity County is much lower than in California overall; median household income is \$36,000, just 59% of the statewide median of \$60,000. Only 34% of Trinity’s households have incomes of more than \$50,000, compared with 58% statewide. In addition, recent unemployment rates are high—18% as of June 2011—compared with California’s rate of 12%.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09







12. Household Income, 2005-09



b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11





14. Household Type, 2010



15. Average Household Size, 2010




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
