

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in Yorba Linda grew by 9% over the past decade to 64,000, similar to the statewide growth rate of 10%. Much of the population gain occurred in the older adult population age 65+, which grew by 68%, while the younger population age 19 and under declined by 7%.


Diversity: Yorba Linda remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though over the last ten years this share fell from 75% to 66%, while the Hispanic share increased from 10% to 14%, and the Asian share increased from 11% to 16% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward over the past decade, with median age increasing from 37 to 42, compared with the statewide median of 35. The portion of the population age 65+ increased from 8% to 12% of total, compared with 11% statewide, while the population of young people decreased from 32% to 27% of total, compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are much more common here than in California as a whole, at 32% of households, compared with 23% statewide, though this share is down from 40% in 2000. Yorba Linda has a high share of family households without children, 45%, up from 39% in 2000 and compared with 36% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is much higher here than in the state overall. Just 5% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 45% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California overall.

Income: Median household income in Yorba Linda is \$114,000, nearly twice the statewide median income of \$60,000. Thirty-five percent of households have incomes of \$150,000 or higher, compared with 12% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




