The California State Library in collaboration with First 5 California presents A Special Night at the State Library The Raising of America: Early Childhood and the Future of Our Nation Wednesday, February 11, 2015

Sacramento, Calif. – In a first-ever event, First 5 California and the California State Library are screening the forthcoming PBS documentary, *The Raising of America: Early Childhood and the Future of Our Nation*, at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel, on Wednesday, February 11 from 5 -7 p.m.

The screening will be followed by a panel discussion whose members include California State Senator Holly J. Mitchell; Creator and Executive Producer for <u>The Raising of America</u> Larry Adelman; Dr. Joshua D. Sparrow, <u>Brazelton Touchpoints Center</u> child psychologist; and Suzanne Flint, Child Development Specialist from the California State Library and principal architect for its <u>Early Learning with Families</u> initiative. The panel moderator is Kim Belshé, Executive Director of <u>First 5 LA</u>. Panelists will discuss how libraries and other organizations help make a major difference in early childhood development.

The Raising of America: Early Childhood and the Future of our Nation is a special overview of the five-part series, which explores early childhood health and development. The documentary examines why child well-being in the U.S. is far below that in other rich countries. The latest discoveries in neuroscience are also probed to see how brain chemistry and environment can positively affect a child's well-being. According to the Executive Producer of *The Raising of America* Larry Adelman, "Why, if we know so much about what our babies and young children need to thrive, do we do so little? How can we as a community, a state and as a nation, do better? That's the debate *The Raising of America* hopes to stimulate."

The California State Library and First 5 California formed this first-ever partnership because of the importance of the latest early childhood development discoveries on the future of our children, our state and our country. Camille Maben, Executive Director of First 5 California states, "Partnerships are key to informing and effectively mobilizing those who care about our youngest children and strive to give them the best start in life.
