We're pleased to announce the 2016-2017 Public Library Staff Education Program is now open to new applicants. This tuition reimbursement program was developed by a team of public library directors and California State Library staff to encourage existing staff members to pursue their Masters in Library and Information Science or a Library Support Staff Certification through the American Library Association.

Library employees who have successfully worked in a California public library or county law library for at least one year and have been officially accepted into or are currently enrolled in a masters or support staff certification program are eligible to apply. The program guidelines and application are available on our website at <http://www.library.ca.gov/grants/lsta/apply.html>. Deadline for application submission is **May 18, 2016**.

There is a competitive review process for all applications. Public Library Staff Education Program funds will be awarded to successful applicants for one academic year. Additional funding is possible in subsequent years. Please review the guidelines for limitations. Priority is given to past grant recipients who are continuing in their studies toward their master's degree or support staff certification. Applications for continuing students in the Public Library Staff Education Program can also be found at the website above. Cooperative Library Systems will continue to manage the reimbursement and reporting processes.
